



STEWARDSHIP PROGRAMME: SEPT & OCT 2024

At our most recent PCC meeting it was agreed that a review of our stewardship as a parish is now a priority.

We rely upon (and are extremely grateful for) the time, energy and financial resources offered by so many in our community. Without you, our parish simply would not flourish in the way it does.

As in lots of areas of life at present, while our spending has been prudent, our basic costs are rising at a faster rate than our income via donations (ie at the offertory on Sunday mornings, by the envelope scheme and by standing order).

At present our very basic weekly costs amount to £985.00 per week, and we receive £348 per week via donations. We have at present the guaranteed rental income from the nursery school, though it will come to an end in September 2025. We are working hard to ensure that this income stream from rentals will not be disrupted but there are no guarantees at this stage.

In the coming weeks I will be writing to members of the electoral roll and to all the members of our worshipping community to ask everyone to consider prayerfully a review of (or to begin) their regular giving. In particular, if you do not at present give regularly via standing order or the envelope scheme, might you consider making your contribution in this way?

You will receive this week a stewardship pack, with details of our present situation, and about how your giving will contribute to the life, mission and future of our Parish. I thank you in advance for giving it your prayerful, careful attention. If you would like to discuss anything with me, I'll be glad to fix a time to meet you. Fr Philip

God's generosity: our response

From the very beginnings of the Christian Church, when small but growing groups of people were meeting together in houses in Jerusalem and the surrounding areas, God's work depended upon the generosity of God's people.

The early Christians lived together and shared what they had. The Israelites were used to giving to God's work and continued to do so, and they drew the Gentiles and others who joined the group of new believers into doing the same.

As Christians we are, and have always been, compelled to give to God's work with great generosity because of God's generous love for humanity. God loves all the people that he has created and he loves us each as individuals. It is for this reason, in response to all that God has done for us and for the whole of humanity, that we are each called to be generous. Our generosity needs to reflect all that we have, all the gifts that we have from God; the time that we have; the skills which God has given us and the financial resources which God has also given to us.

Our generosity in response to God means that our charitable giving should be a prayerfully considered commitment – as generous as we can, but always in proportion to what we can afford. That's an important thing to bear in mind, particularly at the moment as there are so many calls on our time and money in these straitened times.

In the next few weeks we will be invited to think and to pray more about how we might respond to God's generosity in a way that – in our particular circumstances – is generous, committed and proportionate, in order to support and sustain the life, mission and future of our Parish.
